The Clerk reported that unfortunately the Mayor was unable to attend. Councillor Hallett proposed Deputy Mayor Councillor P Rapi take the chair, seconded by Councillor Mrs Brown.

70. APOLOGIES

Apologies received from The Mayor, Councillor Mrs Rossiter and Councillor Dr P Easy.

71. DISCLOSURE OF PERSONAL INTERESTS

None noted at this point.

72. ITEMS TO PRESS

Proposed by Councillor Hallett, seconded by Councillor Mrs Putwain.

Resolved that items of Correspondence and Committee Minutes other than those items marked Not for Publication be given to members of the Press present.

73. CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES

Resolved that the Minutes of the Tenby Town Council held 27th May 2014 be confirmed and signed as accurate with the following amendment:

50d.NP/14/0257 – Rev. Andrew Davies, The Representative Body for the Church in Wales, The Rectory, Church Park, Tenby – Extension to accommodate wc and kitchenette following proposed demolition of pump house and rooflights to existing church roof – St Julians Church, Penniless Cove Hill, The Harbour, Tenby.

Councillor Mrs Rossiter and Councillor Mrs Putwain abstained from the vote on NP/14/0257 planning decision.

74. MATTERS ARISING

49 – (24b) - Mr B Blake, PCC - Restriction of Horse Drawn Carriages – Walled Town, Tenby

The Clerk reported the Horse and Carriage operator had provided up to date insurance and risk assessment documentation for Councillors to view, as requested at a previous meeting.

49 – (33) – South Pembrokeshire Hunt meet

Councillor Mrs Putwain asked if TTC are writing to invite South Pembrokeshire Hunt to take part during Christmas Festivities in Tudor Square, what is TTC liability and who will be liable for Insurance and road closure permission costs? In addition she asked if all the hounds would be kept on leads in line with the Tenby Dog Byw-law.

Councillor Mrs Brown asked Councillor Putwain if she was a member of any anti-hunt group.

Councillor Mrs Putwain responded stating that she was not a member; however she repeated that it was a ruling that dogs should be on leads in specific areas of town.

Councillors discussed the dogs on lead bye-law before, Councillor Rapi asked the Clerk for confirmation on the timings of the dogs on leads Bye-Law. The Clerk stated as far as he was aware the bye-law was for 12 months of the year and not just during the seasonal beach ban. Following further discussion Councillor Rapi asked if the Clerk could clarify the duration of the dogs on leads Bye-law. It was

Resolved that the Clerk contact Mr Tom Hayes, PCC for clarification of the dogs on leads bye-law in place for specific areas in Tenby.

49 – (35) Car Parking Charges

The Clerk reported the response from Mr M Owen following TTC question as to why are Civil Enforcement Officers spending more time in car parks than checking vehicles on the street. He clarified; due to the volume of cars in car parks it is inevitable that it will take longer to check car parking tickets than in a street where possibly only a few cars are parked in bays. Mr Owen has agreed to meet with TTC on the 25th June 2014 at 3.30pm to discuss Councillors concerns in relation to 'A' frames, Street Trading and Car Parking. It was

Resolved that all Councillors would try to attend the meeting with Mr M Owen, Street Care, PCC on Wednesday 25th June 2014 at 3.30pm in the Mayor's Parlour.

75. PLANNING APPLICATION

Councillor Mrs Putwain declared a personal interest on the following item and left the chamber.

a.NP/14/0194 – Mr Mike Evans, C/o Buccaneer Inn, St Julian Street, Tenby – Alterations and provide two storey extension to existing storage building together with change of use of existing storage building into a microbrewery and associated works which include raising of two roof levels and provision of new roof lights, to the rear of The Buccaneer Inn, St. Julian Street, Tenby – Amended plans.

The Clerk said he had been informed by PCNPA that the planning application is contrary to the Local Development Plan; therefore it will be determined by PCNPA Committee. Councillors discussed and viewed the planning application. Councillor Hallett asked if any letters from local residents had been received in relation to this application. The Clerk reported several residents had viewed the plans in the office and he was aware the planning officer was looking into a couple of the queries they highlighted.

Councillor W Rossiter proposed approval as it is a reduction in the height of the building from the previous application and it will be an improvement to the surrounding area, seconded by Councillor Mrs Brown.

RECOMMEND

Councillor Mrs Putwain re-joined the meeting.

76. CORRESPONDENCE

a. Welsh Government – Public Health White Paper consultation

The Clerk outlined the exercise PCC are presently undertaking in relation to the future provision for Public Toilets. However he reported that the Welsh Assembly was specifically asking for Councillors views in relation to consultation on Chapter Five and Chapter Six of the Public Health White Paper Document. Councillors discussed the positive and negative points in relation to Local Town and Community Councils taking on management of Public Conveniences. Councillor Mrs Thomas proposed TTC support the proposal to place a duty on each County Council to develop a strategy on the provision of, and access to, toilets for public use in their area, seconded by Councillor Mrs Putwain.

Resolved that TTC send a letter supporting the proposal to place a duty on each County Council to develop a strategy on the provision of, and access to, toilets for public use in their area.

Councillors discussed the information in relation to Chapter Six of the Public Health White Paper consultation relating to a register to cover cosmetic piercing, tattooing, semi-permanent skin colouring, acupuncture and electrolysis. During the discussion Councillor Mrs Durham felt this was an opportunity to include Street Trading temporary tattoo sellers in the register as they should be under the same ruling as shop owners. TTC should include this comment when responding to the Welsh Assembly and in addition forward the information relating to the register to Mr M Owen, Street Care, PCC.

Councillor Mrs Brown proposed TTC supports the establishment of a National Special Procedures Register to cover cosmetic piercing, tattooing, semi-permanent skin colouring, acupuncture and electrolysis. In addition that TTC suggest consideration be given to include mobile artists which operate on the streets offering temporary tattoos in the register, seconded by Councillor Mrs Thomas.

Resolved that TTC send a letter supporting the establishment of a National Special Procedures Register to cover cosmetic piercing, tattooing, semi-permanent skin colouring, acupuncture and electrolysis. The Town Council suggest that the register also include mobile artists which operate on the streets offering temporary tattoos.

b. Mavis Evans – Tenby Blues Festival Promotional Brochure

Councillor Mrs Brown felt it would be nice to see a forward by Tenby Mayor in the Blues Festival promotional brochure; however she did not feel TTC should pay for this. Therefore it was

Resolved that TTC thank Mrs Mavis Evans for the information; however unfortunately TTC would not be purchasing an advert in the brochure.

c.PCC (via e-mail) – PCC Mid and West Wales Fire Authority representatives

The Clerk reported he had been asked to clarify the PCC representatives for Mid and West Wales Fire Authority following the request for support to refuse the amalgamation of all the present control centres to one central base. Councillor Mrs Putwain proposed TTC write to all three PCC representatives stating TTC are against the proposition to amalgamate smaller call centres to make one large control centre and ask for their support in this matter, seconded by Councillor Mrs Durham.

Resolved that TTC write to all three Pembrokeshire County Councillor Representatives for Mid and West Wales Fire Authority stating TTC are against the proposition to amalgamate smaller call centres to make one large control centre and ask for their support in this matter.

d.Jane Gibson, PCNPA (via e-mail) – Consultation period

Councillor Blackhall felt the response from Ms Jane Gibson PCNPA did not adequately answer the concern highlighted by Councillor Mrs Putwain. He felt TTC are making a planning decision response on behalf of local residents as well as Councillors' individual knowledge; therefore he felt the resident's response to a neighbouring planning application would have an impact on TTC decision. In light of this he felt the time scale for response should be equal and proposed TTC write again to PCNPA as he felt they had missed TTC's original point, seconded by Councillor Mrs Putwain.

Resolved that TTC write again to Ms Jane Gibson PCNPA explaining why TTC felt the time of response by local residents and Statutory Consultees should be synchronised.

e.Stackpole Walled Garden – Invitation to Open Day, 19th June 2014.

Councillor Hallett explained about the excellent work undertaken at Stackpole Gardens and encouraged as many Councillors to attend the forthcoming open day. Regrettably he was unable to attend himself this year. Unfortunately all Councillors present were also unable to attend due to work commitments or prior engagements. It was

Resolved that all Councillors not present be reminded of the Stackpole Walled Garden open day in case they are available to attend.

f.Mr Chris Martin, Hywel Dda University Health Board – Tenby Surgery

Councillor Mrs Brown expressed her disappointment in the way the Local Health Board has dealt with the Health Care provision changes that have, and are still occurring in Tenby. TTC and locals should be aware by now what additional services are being provided for the summer period. We are in the build up to the summer season and no one has been provided with information to relay to locals let alone prospective tourists.

Councillor Mrs Thomas reported Mr David Morrissey Hywel Dda Representative is speaking at the next SEPCHN meeting; therefore any questions TTC would like answer to could be put to him during this meeting.

Councillor Blackhall felt the LHB has a duty to respond to concerns expressed by letter and not to just tell people what they already know. It clearly shows from the way the situation at the GP surgeries has developed what awful decisions have been made. The LHB promised that no changes in services provided by the MIU would occur until the local GPs had agreed to provide part of this service, and an alternative service provider had been found to cover weekends and

bank holidays. However the GPs are under so much pressure at present due to staff shortages they cannot take on additional services without support. He clarified he was not criticising the GP services he was merely stating that the LHB should have been aware and talked with the GPs in depth before closing the MIU and increasing the surgery workload.

Councillor Mrs Brown felt County Councillor Adams gave a poor response when challenged about what level of communication PCC are engaging at with the LHB in relation to maintaining services in Pembrokeshire. She felt PCC should be much stronger in what they are saying to the LHB and fighting on behalf of the local electorate.

The Clerk reported that he has several copies of letters sent to members of the public from the LHB and they all say the exact same information as response letters from the LHB to TTC. In relation to the GP surgery staffing issues the letter states a Locum GP and an additional Nurse Practitioner have temporarily been employed until the vacant GP posts have been filled.

Councillor Rapi felt TTC should write again to our Local Assembly Members as the people of Tenby are extremely concerned about the present health provision being provided, seconded by Councillor Mrs Durham. The Clerk reported that the AMs are raising the health issues with Mr Mark Drakeford Minister for Health and Social Services, Welsh Assembly and the same response is given that the LHB and the CHC are in discussions to resolve the issues and yet we are unclear as to whether these discussions are indeed taking place.

Councillor Hallett said no copies of any documentation relating to discussions and consultations between the LHB and CHC has been provided, therefore we should be asking for evidence of the communication meetings that have, and are ,occurring.

Councillor Blackhall expressed it was sad the LHB felt an occasional Red Cross First Aid Service, an enhanced pharmacy service, first aid from RNLI lifeguards on the beach and an advertising campaign are a comparative service previously provided by the Emergency Nurse Practitioners at the MIU.

Councillor Mrs Brown felt strongly that PCC could and should be doing more to ensure the local electorate are receiving an adequate level of care in the community from the LHB. We have no idea what they are doing to help when Tenby have been fighting all the way along to save the services people believe are vital for the community, and the holiday destination where we live. She proposed that TTC write to PCC and ask them to get involved in the present health issues relating to Tenby, seconded by Councillor Mrs Durham.

Councillor Mrs Thomas proposed TTC send a copy of all letters in relation to health matters be forwarded to the Community Health Council, who are the voice of the people, seconded by Councillor Mrs Durham.

Councillors jointly felt that all representatives on the LHB should be made aware of the present specific concerns Tenby residents have in relation to Health Care in our town; therefore it was

Resolved that TTC write to Mr T Purt Director of Health, Hywel Dda Health Board, again, to express the increasing level of concern being felt by local residents following the closure of Tenby MIU. The letter should outline specific concerns relating to the provision of service of minor injuries that was to be undertaken by Local GP practices and other service providers. However in light of problems being experienced by the Tenby GP practice where does this leave cover for local residents. In addition a copy of the letter to be forwarded to Mr Mark Drakeford, Minister for Health and Social Services, Welsh Assembly, all local AM's and LHB members for their information.

Resolved that TTC write to County Councillor J Adams, Chairman, PCC requesting their involvement and support in relation to the present health issues in Tenby.

Resolved that copies of all letter are forwarded to the CHC to maintain their awareness of all level of concern continually being expressed in relation to local health care matters in Tenby.

g.Peter Palmer, Carten 100 – Carten 2015

Councillor Hallett said he was pleased to see plans for next year's Carten with enhancements was in progress as he felt they bring prestige to the town.

h.Mr and Mrs Parry (via e-mail) – Camper van parking in Tenby

Councillor Hallett felt the response from a private car park employee should have been accurate and clearly was not; therefore they should not have commented on PCC policy for Campervans.

The Clerk reported he had discussed the matter with Mr M Owen PCC and clarified the areas Campervans are permitted to park and informed Mr & Mrs Parry immediately on receipt of the information.

Councillor Hallett proposed TTC write to St Mary's Parochial Church Committee, forwarding the accurate information relating to Campervan parking to them, to ensure their employees provide factual information for tourist in the future, seconded by Councillor Blackhall.

Resolved that TTC write to St Mary's Parochial Church Committee forwarding the accurate information relating to Campervan parking to them, to ensure their employees provide factual information for tourist in the future.

i.Luca Chiffi – Street Trading Licence

The Clerk confirmed for Councillors that TTC voted in support of Mr Chiffi operating outside the town walls.

Councillor Blackhall explained that not everyone agreed with the street licence being approved; therefore even though it was by a slim majority TTC did support the application. However he expressed dismay at the fact when TTC support something it is refused and when TTC propose refusal of a licence it appears it is granted by PCC. In light of recent decisions he felt PCC are just going through the motions of a consulting exercise and clearly the opinion of consultees are not taken seriously. TTC has been talking with PCC for years about the problems associated with street trading licences and clearly the present system is not working; therefore the way forward is to revoke all licences at the end of this year and reallocate annual licences each year.

Councillor W Rossiter felt he was happy with the PCC decision as TTC has a stated policy on Street Trading and they should stand by it. PCC have the final say and TTC can only recommend on these issues.

Councillor Mrs Putwain totally agreed with Councillor Blackhall, Mr M Owen has met with TTC and agreed with Councillors about the specific problems experienced in Tenby and then he implements the opposite action. Therefore TTC becomes disheartened and appears to be making no progress in relation to monitoring Street Trading.

Councillor Rapi reminded Councillors that each one of them is elected as a representative for the people of the town; therefore PCC should not be ignoring TTC views.

Councillor Blackhall proposed a letter is sent to Mr M Owen PCC, formally stating that TTC recommend PCC issue present Street Traders with notice that all licences will be revoked at the end of the year. A joint policy will be written by PCC and TTC for Street Trading in the future, prior to the allocation of new Street Trading licences, seconded by Councillor Mrs Thomas.

Resolved that a letter is sent to Mr M Owen PCC, formally stating that TTC recommend PCC issue present Street Traders with notice that all licences will be revoked at the end of the year. A joint policy will be written by PCC and TTC for Street Trading in the future, prior to the allocation of new Street Trading licences.

Councillor Mrs Brown personally felt TTC should support Mr Chiffi's appeal against refusal of his Street Trading licence. Firstly it included areas that do not have trading at present and he is a young entrepreneur who sought advice from PCC before buying his van and gained support from TTC. Therefore she proposed TTC support his appeal, seconded by Councillor Blackhall.

Councillor Rapi took a vote, resulting in six votes for, two against. It was

Resolved that TTC support Mr Chiffi's appeal against the refusal of his PCC Street Trading Licence.

j. Victoria Thomas, Tenby ATC (via e-mail) – Dog fouling, Tenby Railway Station

Councillor Hallett agreed the main walkway through to the railway station had become a regular dog walking route with owners not clearing up the dogs' excrement. In addition until recently the walkway had also been a very poorly lit area.

Councillor Brown, as a dog walker herself, has witnessed and challenged owners who do not clean up after their dogs and received verbal abuse in return. This problem is difficult to solve as it is private land and the people offending know who they are and continue despite plenty of notices and reminders.

Councillor Blackhall felt only enforcement will work; therefore he proposed TTC forward the letter to Mr T Hayes PCC and ask if the area can be included on the Dog Wardens patrol, seconded by Councillor Hallett.

Resolved that TTC forward the letter to Mr T Hayes PCC and ask if the area can be included on the Dog Wardens patrol.

77. ACCOUNTS FOR MAY 2014

The Clerk informed Councillors the annual contribution from the War Graves Commission for maintenance of Tenby War Graves had been received and previously TTC has passed on the grant to Tenby Sea Cadets who carry out the War Grave Maintenance. Councillor Blackhall proposed TTC forward the annual contribution from the War Graves Commission for maintenance of Tenby War Graves to Tenby Sea Cadets, seconded by Councillor Hallett.

Resolved that under Section 214 Local Government Act 1972 TTC donate £204 to Tenby Sea Cadets for maintenance of the War Graves.

Councillor Mrs Putwain took no part in discussion or vote.

Councillors discussed the accounts for May 2014. Councillor Hallett proposed acceptance of the May 2014 accounts, seconded by Councillor Mrs Brown.

Resolved that TTC accept the May 2014 accounts.

Councillor Hallett thanked the Clerk for his continued hard work.

78. REPORTS BY COUNCILLORS ON OUTSIDE BODIES

Councillor Blackhall reported on the successful Tenby United Rugby Club event held recently in the De Valence. He was also pleased to say the Bingo evenings are going from strength to strength with Tenby Mayor calling the numbers. The De Valence Café will be opening within the next week.

Councillor Mrs Putwain attended the Tenby Charity Trustees meeting; however sadly they were not quorate.

Councillor Hallett said he attended the wedding of Reverend Canon Andrew Davies and Reverend Alex Grace. The wedding was lovely from beginning to the end and praised the 'Soupermen' and the ladies of the church for all their hard work and support organising the celebration.

Councillor Mrs Thomas reported on information she had received about a Care in the Community £5000 Grant and asked if TTC would consider registering an interest; therefore enabling access to a grant pack with further details. Councillor Hallett proposed TTC register an interest for the Care in the Community Grant Scheme, seconded by Councillor Mrs Brown.

Resolved that the Clerk on behalf of TTC register an interest for the Care in the Community £5000 Grant scheme.

The Clerk reported on the 70th D-Day landing service he arranged at short notice with Major Martyn Clements, Tenby Salvation Army following discussion with the Mayor. The service was attended by the Mayor, Councillor Mrs S Lane, Tenby Town Councillors, Major Clements, Rector Andrew Davies, Mr Bryn Rees, Tenby Baptist Church and Mr Tipton who laid a wreath on behalf of the RAF. Unfortunately the Mayor's Chaplain was unable to attend due to a commitment at the Catholic Church. A short service was conducted by all present following the playing of the last post. He expressed his appreciation to all who assisted in arranging the service and attended at short notice.

79. MEDIA ITEMS

Councillor Mrs Durham reported Tenby has had positive media coverage on Radio 2 and in Daily newspapers reporting on Tenby being the best beach in Europe.

Councillor Hallett reported Tenby being the best beach in Europe was a feature in a German magazine.

80. POSSIBLE EXTENSION OF PEDESTRIANISATION TO BANK HOLIDAY PERIODS

Councillor Blackhall highlighted the possibility of extending pedestrianisation to include bank holiday weekend periods to seek views on this suggestion from local residents, harbour users, shop keepers and walled town residents.

Councillor Mrs Brown said the initial eight week trial received opposition from the Local Residents Association; however she felt it was now presently working. Therefore it could now be the time to consider extending the longer holiday period, to include May, June, July and August.

Councillor Mrs Putwain felt the logistics of when you can drive into town and when you can not would cause increased confusion. In addition it is a way of producing a blanket ban on traffic in the walled town from a back door approach. Only a mad person would want to drive through Tenby walled town on a bank holiday. Delivery drivers presently struggle to bring parcels to town residents during pedestrianisation and increasing the duration of the ban would cause the drivers and residents many more problems. She felt at present the pedestrianisation scheme is working therefore 'if it's not broke don't fix it'.

Councillor W Rossiter totally agreed with Councillor Mrs Putwain increasing the duration for particular times would just enrage tourists and not be a good move for Tenby.

Councillor Mrs Brown totally disagreed stating it would be a 'Good move for Tenby'. It would be good for businesses as at present they only have six weeks to make to most of the scheme. Tourism is the main income for the area and Tenby needs to monopolise on the added advantage of pedestrianisation.

Councillor Mrs Putwain failed to understand why Councillor Mrs Brown did not feel tourists use cafes during non pedestrianisation periods; therefore it seems to be a matter of opinion.

Councillor Rapi felt that the suggestion for a four month period of pedestrianisation was an adventurous ask; however he felt it was good to seek local opinions.

Councillor Mrs Durham said many towns are documented as using shared spaces schemes and she stated Tenby has been doing this for years.

Councillor Mrs Thomas felt the six week pedestrianisation scheme stopped many locals from surrounding villages coming into Tenby; it makes them feel not welcome. Therefore she too felt it should remain unchanged.

Councillor Blackhall felt he had received interesting views from Councillors on the subject and welcomed more views from residents.

81. FINANCIAL OFFICER/CLERK'S ITEMS

The Clerk reported he had received a letter from PCNPA stating Planning Application NP/14/0000, alterations to convert the former Royal British Legion has been withdrawn.

In response to the letter from St Teilo's School Governors highlighting concerns relating to the maintenance of the school, he was now aware Mr I Westley had visited the school personally and formulated a series of proposals which are documented in TTC office for Councillor's to view the concerns that are being addressed.

Councillor Mrs Brown felt a copy of Mr Westley's response should be forwarded to Councillor Dr P Easy as he is TTC school governor representative for St Teilo's School.

Councillor Hallett reported the Walled Town Conference is being held in Chichester. As TTC are members if anyone wished to attend the itinerary was available in the TTC offices. Unfortunately he personally was unable to attend this year.

The Clerk informed Councillors that the new Director of the NHS in England seems to favour a move away from centralised large services and a move back to the local community service of health care. Unfortunately Wales is governed independently and not under this move back to community cottage approach of care.

Councillors discussed the issues raised by the Director of NHS for England and Councillor Hallett proposed TTC write to Mr Mark Drakeford, Minister for Health and Social Services, Welsh Assembly and ask for his and the Welsh Assembly views in relation to the move away from large centralised centres of care, back to local community care centres, seconded by Councillor Mrs Thomas.

Resolved that TTC write to Mr Mark Drakeford, Minister for Health and Social Services, Welsh Assembly and ask for his and the Welsh Assembly views in relation to the suggested move away from large centralised centres of care, back to local community care centres in England.

82. DATE AND TIME OF NEXT MEETING

86. MATTERS ARISING

68 – Garden Storage

The Clerk reported he had received communication from Mr B Cooke, PCC stating he would be liaising with other PCC officers in relation to the Nursery Gardens area and will report back to TTC once he has a response to the initial request.

Financial costing to water the gardens not covered by PCC maintenance contract this year are still awaited.

87. FINANCIAL OFFICER/CLERK'S ITEMS

Tenby Notice Board

The Clerk reported the De Valence Trust are now leasing the café and the lessee has expressed concern in relation to the Notice board stored in the alleyway as it is directly in front of the café fire exit. At a previous TTC meeting the Mayor said she was aware Tenby Rugby Club had

expressed an interest in utilising the notice board within their grounds. Discussions have been held with County Councillor M Evans to ascertain if the Rugby Club still proposes to use the notice board, with confirmation received.
