126. APOLOGIES

Apologies received from Councillor P Rapi and Councillor A Brown.

127. DISCLOSURE OF PERSONAL INTERESTS

Councillor Blackhall, Councillor Mrs Brown, Councillor Mrs Rossiter, Councillor Hallett and the Mayor declared an interest on item 11, De Valence.

128. ITEMS TO PRESS

Proposed by Councillor Mrs Thomas, seconded by Councillor Hallett.

Resolved that items of Correspondence and Committee Minutes other than those items marked Not for Publication be given to members of the Press present.

129 CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES

Resolved that the Minutes of the Tenby Town Council held 9^h July 2013 be confirmed and signed as accurate with the following amendment:

110b – Street care

For accuracy Councillor Mrs Rossiter reported the mobile tattoo seller narrowed the access pathway into HSBC bank and not Barclays bank.

117 – Tenby Events Notice board

Councillor Mrs Putwain said the resolution on the events notice board was not accurate and should say: Resolved that TTC find a suitable site for the notice board in the town. For accuracy Councillor Mrs Brown asked that Tenby Civic Society be added to the list of donors towards the cost of the town notice boards.

130 MATTERS ARISING

107 - Media Item- Director of Education PCC

The Clerk reported he had received a response from Mr David Hopkins PCC Education Department in relation to TTC requesting a meeting to discuss Tenby Primary Welsh/English School proposal, prior to the end of the consultation period; however the letter stated that the authority had complied with statutory requirements on consultation and statutory notices. In relation to the library provision that this is a separate matter and any issues relating to this should be discussed with Mr M Cavanagh PCC. The Clerk explained that Councillors received a copy of this letter via e-mail prior to discussion at this meeting as unfortunately it arrived after the agenda had been circulated.

Councillor Mrs Thomas felt the response was not a satisfactory answer; she personally had been asked questions by local residents that she was unable to answer due to lack of communication and consultation with TTC from PCC Education Department. She felt so strongly about the lack of consultation that she would consider sending a Freedom of Information request to discover who had actually been consulted on the proposal. Questions Councillor Mrs Thomas had been asked are as follows:

- Is it true Tenby Infants School is to be bulldozed?
- How do PCC plan to tackle traffic congestion that will inevitably be increased with additional pupil numbers when traffic management is already a serious matter of concern?
- In relation to the library aspect, firstly where are people going to park and secondly will there be restrictions on access during school hours or will everyone need CRB checks to enter the premises.

Councillor Mrs Thomas felt that traffic concerns needed to be addressed before plans are processed further and as no meeting appears to be forthcoming TTC should document all concerns expressed in a letter and sent them to PCC Education Department.

Councillor W Rossiter said that there had been a consultation at the library, in the form of a questionnaire that asked for suggestions of a suitable library site.

Councillor Blackhall said the issue of consultation is a problem; however it needs to be kept in context as the project is a huge opportunity and investment for the town. He agreed more information was a valid point and the ability to view plans as soon as they are available would be a tremendous positive, he noted that the project has already been put back a year and money allocated from the Welsh Assembly will certainly have a time scale of availability, therefore all these points need to be taken into consideration.

Councillor Mrs Rossiter said she initially commented on the lack of communication because she felt TTC were being kept in the dark and things could have been pushed through or passed without people being aware, her goal will have been achieved if locals are kept informed, made aware of any proposed changes and given the opportunity to consult on matters.

County Councillor Evans reassured fellow Councillors that work on the proposal for the Tenby Welsh and English Primary Education Facilities is progressing and information along with

plans will be made available in due course, however things take time and Tenby people need to welcome this opportunity for local children's education and surely do not want to miss out.

Councillor Mrs Thomas felt following information provided by Councillor Evans she was now able to answer some local residents concerns and hoped that all relevant information will be communicated with TTC in due course. She asked Councillor Evans if he would personally request someone from PCC education department to visit and present the plans to TTC when they are available.

Councillor Dr Easy joined the meeting.

109 – 46 High Street, Tenby

The Clerk reported that Mr Scourfield, Conservation Officer, PCNPA is liaising with the owners of 46, High Street in relation to tidying the rear of their premises; however he is aware that PCC has a regeneration grant paint scheme available at present for town businesses. Documentation about this scheme is available in TTC offices.

110 – Royal Gate House Site

Councillor Mrs Putwain reported concerns had been expressed to her in relation to the Royal Gate House site that contractors are only building the McCarthy and Stone project and not progressing onto the Premier Inn aspect. The Clerk confirmed he had been informed that the present contractors will complete the McCarthy and Stone project and a new contractor will be building the Premier Inn section. In relation to the Cinema site that is still in the process of appeal at the Welsh Assembly.

The Clerk was asked for confirmation on rumours that the developers of the South Beach Development had gone into liquidation. The Clerk had heard the same rumour but at this time had no further information for Councillors.

114 – Media – Tenby MIU

The Clerk reported he had e-mailed a copy of the reply received from Mr M Drakeford AM, to Councillors outlining his response in relation to TTC's request that he visits to discuss the proposed closure of Tenby MIU. However as Councillors are aware he declined to visit as the matter was for local resolution and it would be inappropriate for him to discuss the Local Health Board's decision.

Councillor Mrs Thomas felt disappointed by his response and hoped for a satisfactory answer to the question TTC has presented to the LHB that will be answered at the 25th July 2013 meeting.

116 – 'A' Frames and Street Obstructions

Councillor Mrs Rossiter took no part in discussions on this item.

Councillor Blackhall reported on the recent 'A' Frame walkabout with Mr M Owen, Tenby Chamber of Trade representative and the Clerk. Every business with A Frames was visited where discussion took place on all aspects of signage, insurance and how things could be improved. It was a long process but appears to have had a positive response. Many businesses have made an effort to improve and reduce the problem. In addition whilst walking around Mr Owen took the opportunity to enforce rules to pedlars and street traders present on that

particular day. He encouraged businesses to assist in monitoring pedlars outside their premises by outlining the present rules for pedlar licences. The next step in the process is to carry out a follow up assessment visit however it was decided that this should take place following pedestrianisation due to the inevitable changes that occur during café culture.

Councillor W Rossiter personally felt little had changed in the 'A' Frame situation following the recent walkabout.

Councillor Mrs Rossiter rejoined the meeting.

117 Tenby Events Notice Board

Councillor Mrs Putwain said in relation to the local community purchasing the notice boards she was aware that the old De Valence Trust did not contribute towards the cost and it was rubbish to say that the boards were bought by the town for the town. She felt the record should be put straight explaining that she fought for the retained money to be paid to the sculptor, however this did not happen and so as he was not paid for his work in full she asked that the board be given back to the sculptor for him to dispose of it how he wished.

Councillor Mrs Brown disagreed stating that the people did contribute towards the notice boards, even if they were not constituted groups but unfortunately PCC sited one at the wrong angle causing an outcry. She continued by challenging Councillor Mrs Putwain to obtain evidence during the six week recess of people who did not want the notice boards and provide it at the next TTC meeting.

The Mayor proposed the Tenby Events Notice Board be discussed again in private, seconded by Councillor Mrs Brown.

Resolved that the Events Notice Board be discussed again in private matters.

131. PLANNING APPLICATION

a. NP/13/0297 – Mr Stuart Mackay, 1 Cambrian Cottages, Narberth Road, Tenby – Two storey side extension, excavation of amenity space and raising the height of boundary wall, 1 Cambrian Cottages, Narberth Road, Tenby.

Councillors discussed and viewed the planning application asking if the building was listed. The Clerk confirmed it was not a listed building. Councillor Mrs Rossiter proposed approval as it is improving and enhancing the property, seconded by Councillor Hallett.

RECOMMEND

Approval as it will improve and enhance the property.

The Mayor suggested the following two planning applications be discussed together as they pertained to the same plans. Councillor Mrs Putwain proposed NP/13/0299 and NP/13/0300 be discussed together, seconded by Councillor Hallett.

b. NP/13/0299 – Mrs Jacqui Fairey c/o Quay People, 3 Blake House, Admirals Way, Canary Wharf, London – Construction of glass conservatory over part of east facing rear terrace and internal alterations to provide improved access to conservatory and to provide additional bedroom and en-suite facilities – Lower Deck, Pier Hill, Tenby.

Councillors discussed and viewed the planning application; Councillor W Rossiter proposed approval as the proposal will not detract from the appearance of the building, seconded by Councillor Dr Easy.

NP/13/0300 – Listed Building – Mrs Jacqui Fairey c/o Quay People, 3 Blake House, Admirals Way, Canary Wharf, London – Construction of glass conservatory over part of east facing rear terrace and internal alterations to provide improved access to conservatory and to provide additional bedroom and en-suite facilities – Lower Deck, Pier Hill, Tenby.

Councillors discussed and viewed the planning application; Councillor W Rossiter proposed approval as the proposal will not detract from the appearance of the building, seconded by Councillor Dr Easy.

RECOMMEND

Approval as the proposal will not detract from the appearance of the building.

The Clerk informed Councillors he had received two further planning applications after sending out the agenda. He had informed members by e-mail about the application as a decision would be required during TTC recess. Councillor Mrs Rossiter proposed the additional planning applications NP/13/0317 and NP/13/0303 be accepted and discussed together, seconded by Councillor W Rossiter.

d. NP/13/0317 - (Listed Building) - Mr and Mrs Alan Brooks, Lower Albion, Pier Hill, Tenby – Convert cellar and adapt first floor to create an annex to Lower Albion for holiday let accommodation – Lower Albion, Pier Hill, Tenby.

Councillors discussed and viewed the planning application; Councillor Hallett proposed approval as the proposal is a sympathetic adaption to a building and will provide another unit of accommodation for tourists, seconded by Councillor Mrs Thomas.

RECOMMEND

e. NP/13/0303 - Mr and Mrs Alan Brooks, Lower Albion, Pier Hill, Tenby – Convert cellar and adapt first floor to create an annex to Lower Albion for holiday let accommodation – Lower Albion, Pier Hill, Tenby.

Councillors discussed and viewed the planning application; Councillor Hallett proposed approval as the proposal is a sympathetic adaption to a building and will provide another unit of accommodation for tourists, seconded by Councillor Mrs Thomas.

132. **PLANNING CORRESPONDENCE**

Councillors reviewed the information, it was

b. PCNPA – Planning refusal – 63, Upper Hill Park, Tenby

The Clerk reported he had received a refusal of planning permission on NP/13/0196 - 63, Upper Hill Park, Tenby. Councillor W Rossiter asked for clarification of the reason for refusal, the reason noted was due to the close proximity of the decking that would overlook the neighbouring property. It was

Resolved that the information be noted.

c. PCNPA – Planning withdrawn – Former Royal Mail Depot, The Green, Tenby

The Clerk reported he had received a withdrawal of planning application NP/13/0168 – Former Royal Mail Depot, The Green, Tenby. It was

Resolved that the information be noted.

133. **CORRESPONDENCE**

a. Angela Burns AM (via e-mail) – Street Traders

Councillors discussed the letter before Councillor Blackhall proposed TTC draft a response to be discussed in September 2013 prior to sending to Angela Burns AM, seconded by Councillor Mrs Brown.

Resolved that a draft response be prepared for discussion at the first meeting in September

b. Mr Marc Owen, PCC (via e-mail) – Street Trading consents

Councillor Mrs Rossiter highlighted that some of the Market stalls are food stalls; unfortunately the new pavements are porous and any spillages are marking the slabs. She requested perhaps a bucket of water could be thrown over the slabs to assist with the cleaning particularly during hot spells with minimal rain to assist with natural cleaning.

Councillor Mrs Brown felt that the street cleaning wagon could clean the pavements periodically; however Councillor Evans reported that due to the height of the new kerbs the machine cannot access the pavements.

Councillor Evans said Tudor Square is a victim of its own success; it looks amazing and is full of locals and visitor sitting enjoying the atmosphere. The church and the Dyster Fountain look spectacular and the children's floral baskets along with business flower pots are being well watered and brightening up the whole area. He continued explaining the act of watering pots and baskets will clean areas of the footpaths at the same time.

c. Mr Ian Westley – Road closure notice Tenby10K

The Clerk outlined the advanced notice given by PCC transport department of the road closures for the Tenby 10K on Sunday 28th July 2013. It was

Resolved that the information be noted.

d. Rachel Gibby, PCC – Photographic competition

The Clerk explained about the notification received on a photographic competition organised by PCC Good Neighbourhood Scheme. The competition is for young people to take photographs of anyone 50+. They hope to encourage as many young people to enter as possible.

Resolved that the information be noted.

134. GRANT APPLICATION

a. Tenby Museum and Art Gallery – Archaeological display

Councillor Hallett declared an interest as a museum trustee.

The Museum had submitted a request for grant aid towards an exhibit on the archaeological discovery of the 'Lydstep Pig'

Councillor Mrs Putwain felt the museum application should be supported as it is a good local cause. In addition she felt TTC should write and provide support to the museum to get the remains of the Lydstep Pig back from storage at the Natural History Museum.

Councillor W Rossiter felt that he did not support giving to the museum as they charge an admission fee and this money should be used for this type of purchase.

Councillor Evans supported Councillor Mrs Putwain's view as the museum provides an educational resource for all local school children and local residents give their time voluntary to provide additional help. He expressed how lucky Tenby is to have this facility.

Councillor Hallett provided information as a trustee for Councillors stating that the museum is a valuable research and resources centre for students and they have to charge an entrance fee to cover overhead expenses. The paid employees are helpful and excellent with information they provide for the town.

Councillor Blackhall said he would love to see free admission to the museum, however sadly funding is not available to allow this.

Councillor Mrs Putwain proposed TTC donate £216.46, the full funding requested, for the archaeological display, seconded by Councillor Evans.

Resolved that under Section 144 LGA 1972 TTC donate £216.46 to Tenby Museum and Art Gallery.

Councillor W Rossiter voted against the resolution.

135. REPORTS BY COUNCILLORS ON OUTSIDE BODIES

Councillor Mrs Brown reported on the Tenby Regeneration meeting that was very positive with the Regeneration team supportive of Tenby's short term objectives with some funding already secured. A press release will be released in due course outlining the whole regeneration of Tenby with the emphasis and focus on environment, economy and people.

The Mayor reported that last weekend she had the privilege of standing on the finish line at the 2013 Long Course Weekend to greet Gareth Scotcher and Nicky Rees as they finished the marathon. Their faces, and those of everyone around, expressed the pride for the achievement of two local men. She continued reporting on having attended the opening of the Sculpture exhibition at Tenby Museum and the opening of the Art Club's Exhibition at St John's Church Hall. Both events were very enjoyable and some wonderful paintings are on display for anyone to see. Lastly she reported having attended the annual Haverfordwest River Festival which was very enjoyable.

136. DE VALENCE

The Clerk reported he had only one item in relation to the De Valence from the recent Trust meeting that required discussion in private business.

137. MEDIA ITEMS

Councillor W Rossiter reported that the White Queen series being shown on television had featured the escape of Henry Tudor from Tenby.

Councillor Evans reported that Sky news weather bulletins often feature Tenby and in addition whenever the heat wave was mentioned on BBC Wales news the back drop often featured Tenby.

It was also discussed that in the recent Sunday Telegraph there was a full page article featuring Tenby Harbour.

Councillor W Rossiter said the Guardian recently had a feature in the travel section about wonderful Pembrokeshire beaches, however the reporter had also reported on items she had discovered on the beaches. Councillor Hallett added that it is inevitable that items will be washed up on the beaches and get caught in the flotsam and jetsam.

138. TENBY IN BLOOM

The Mayor reported she had attended ten Tenby families of schools presenting prizes to pupils that had entered the Tenby in Bloom colouring competition and prepared hanging baskets of flowers, that they had planting, watering and nurturing them to grow with care and attention. The children expressed their delight in being involved and she had a letter from one school that felt they wanted to note their enjoyment at being part of Tenby in Bloom.

She continued providing an update on projects in hand and coming to fruition including:

- The Station has been a fantastic success and looking so much better even the graffiti has been painted over. Arriva trains have been working with the In Bloom Committee and made a vast difference to an area that has been difficult to address for some time.

The Clerk added that the frequency of emptying the waste bin outside the station railings has been increased and PCC are looking into the possibility of using a double bin on this site.

- The sensory garden is looking good and will flourish once the plants fill out into the beds.
- The In Bloom gardening team tidied up The Green area and now it looks much more pleasing on the eye.
- International Communities in Bloom have been in contact and have now received the portfolio along with the planned itinerary and judging route. Wales in Bloom judging will take place on Friday 26th July.
- Three young gentlemen working towards their Duke of Edinburgh awards have been weeding and sweeping Castle Hill and have done a very good job.
- Gilroy Phillips fencing is partly painted and 51 bags of waste had been removed from the Old Cemetery entrance.

The Mayor thanked everyone for their support and hard work and hoped everyone would continue to keep on top of all the work during the season. However if anyone else is able to help this would really be appreciated and they will be made very welcome.

Councillor W Rossiter reported that there seems to be an amount of rubbish collecting on the Esplanade Cliffs and at the edge of the Battery Gardens area. The Clerk said the Coastguards tend to this problem and have collected the rubbish bags ready to tackle the task as they are the only ones who can access the area.

139. HERRING GULLS

The Mayor reported that Tenby seems to be experiencing more problems with Herring gulls and she had read online that they are protected but can be controlled under a special licence. They are causing a health and safety problem and are out of control. She proposed that TTC write to PCC and ask them for help in controlling the Herring gull problems

Councillor Hallett said the cause of the herring gull's scavenging is the black rubbish sacks containing food waste being left out uncovered so they can rip them open.

Councillor Mrs Durham said the herring gulls seriously need controlling as they are causing many health and safety issues that need addressing. Councillors also expressed concern about the number of pigeons in town.

Councillor Mrs Rossiter said after visiting Bletchley Park and hearing the work that pigeons did has changed her views on these birds.

Councillor W Rossiter felt that pigeons are filthy verminous creatures that are making a mess; however herring gulls are here all year round; they are forthright birds looking out for their families. As they are becoming rarer and leaving the seaside we do not need to control them.

Councillor Mrs Putwain added that the herring gull excrement is poisonous and is over many benches and will therefore be on peoples clothing.

Councillor Dr Easy felt that when writing to PCC specific and severe health and safety risks need to be documented and proven.

The Mayor proposed that TTC write to PCC to request why we need their assistance in controlling the herring gull problem in Tenby, seconded by Councillor Mrs Durham.

Resolved that TTC write to PCC to request why we need their assistance in controlling the herring gull problem in Tenby.

Councillor W Rossiter voted against the resolution and Councillor Hallett abstained.

140. TENBY HARBOUR SLUICE

Councillor Mrs Rossiter reported that she has been approached by several people about making the harbour sluice a safer place for health and safety reasons. She appreciated that it is a listed structure that cannot be filled in; however perhaps it could be covered with decking to allow picnicking or storage of dinghies. She felt that the fact that there had not been more accidents was ‘a miracle,’ and at present there is a boat in the sluice permanently.

Councillor Mrs Thomas said the previous Harbourmaster produced a feasibility study in support of an alternative sensible entrance into the sluice from the Mayor’s slipway.

Councillor Mrs Putwain said the Clerk reported previously about the Harbour enhancement which included repairing the sluice gates so perhaps we should wait and see how effective this work is before discussing it further.

Councillor W Rossiter asked if the sluice could be cleaned out and sand put in situ to make a child friendly play area. Councillor Hallett felt it was a biodiversity area and many animals and creatures are found in the sediment.

Councillor Evans supported Councillor Mrs Rossiter’s idea and proposed TTC write to Anne Robinson in the Regeneration Department of PCC to ask her to look into possible usage of the harbour sluice and send an open invite to the Sea Cadets, Sailing Club and Tenby Harbour Users to provide representatives at any scheduled meetings to discuss ideas of possible alternative uses, seconded by Councillor Mrs Brown.

Resolved that TTC write to Mrs A Robinson PCC and ask her to look into possible alternative usages of the Harbour Sluice and arrange a meeting with representatives from Tenby Sea Cadets, Tenby Sailing Club, Tenby Harbour Users and TTC to discuss any possible alternative uses.

Councillor Mrs Putwain and Councillor W Rossiter voted against the resolution.

Councillor Evans left the meeting.

141. CORPORATION FUNERAL BIER

Councillor Hallett said he felt we were fortunate to have the Tenby Bier however it requires a new home and some restoration work. At present it is stored in the De Valence Café as a temporary measure, however this cannot be permanent as the café will eventually be used. Previously Manorbier Community Council offered to store the bier in their Bier House due to their bier being on permanent loan to St Fagan’s Welsh Museum of life. He suggested TTC

reconsider contacting Manorbier Community Council to see if the offer is still available and house it on long term loan.

The Mayor felt it should not be lent on a long term loan as in the future an alternative home in Tenby may become available

All alternative places to house the bier have been tried and were discussed; however none of them have been successful. It was proposed by Councillor Hallett that TTC contact Manorbier Community Council and asks if the offer to house the Bier is still a possibility, seconded by Councillor Mrs Putwain.

Resolved that the Clerk contact Manorbier Community Council to request if the offer to housing Tenby Bier is still a possibility.

142. FINANCIAL OFFICER/CLERK'S ITEMS

a. Update on outstanding matters from previous meeting

The Clerk reported that he had received a response from Mr C Payne PCC in relation to vehicle activity on Tenby South Beach. He stated that the vehicles have permission and there are rules when driving on the beach. The Mayor asked if Mr Payne could remind the people using vehicles on the beach of the rules for doing so.

b. Delegation of authority to deal with urgent matters during the Summer recess.

The Clerk requested delegated authority from TTC to allow him to deal with urgent matters during the summer recess following liaison with the Mayor.

Councillor Mrs Rossiter proposed delegation of authority to the Clerk to deal with urgent matters, seconded by Councillor Mrs Thomas.

Resolved that the Clerk be delegated authority to deal with urgent matters during the summer recess.

The Clerk reported that Mr Salmon, Police Commissioner had responded to TTC request for his opinion on Street Trading, Pedlar and Service Provider issues. His response was to state that his priorities are all outlined in his police and crime plan and he suggested TTC maintain good communication with the local Police Inspector.

143. DATE AND TIME OF NEXT MEETING

Resolved that the next meeting will take place on Tuesday 3rd September 2013 at 7.30pm.

147. MATTERS ARISING

102 – Surplus Notice Boards

The Mayor requested to delay discussion on the Events Notice Board till the next scheduled TTC meeting.

101- De Valence Forecourt Bollards

The Clerk reported he had not made any further progress forward on the retractable bollards for the De Valence frontage. Councillors discussed the bollards that are in situ outside Birt & Co, St Julian Street, Tenby. The Clerk said he would discuss the matter with the owners and obtain any information on suppliers they may have.

125 – De Valence - Emergency Lighting

The Clerk reported the emergency lighting issues had been address and were now fully compliant with legislation. The work had come in slightly under budget. Councillor Hallett thanked the Clerk for actioning the work and ensuring it met the health and safety guidelines.

148. FINANCIAL OFFICER/CLERK’S ITEMS

a. Dog Waste Bag provision

The Clerk explained that it has always been a concern to TTC that the cost of dog waste bags is so high. In view of this research has been undertaken to find a more cost effective solution. He continued by outlining the findings documented in the report made available to Councillors.
