Volunteering Opportunities:

If anyone in your group, or anyone else for that matter, is interested in doing some volunteering, here are some opportunities. If your group has some volunteering opportunities, please send in details and they can be added to the list.

Tenby Community Fridge: Can anyone spare half an hour on Tuesdays or Fridays before the fridge and cafe close at 4. Around 3.30, encourage anyone in the cafe to take stuff from the fridge-surprisingly, some still think it's only for the needy. Then clear anything that you know will be no use the next day, such as baguettes of any size, most of the rolls, unless they're full of preservatives - like the burger buns and hot dog rolls that we often get - and any unsliced bread. Also any yellowing vegetables, dodgy fruit, etc. All these things get put into the "non holey" plastic bags and placed in the Blue bin outside. Only issue is that all plastic and paper wrappings must be removed. Soft plastic goes in the recycling box and I usually collect bags with film and any other rubbish and either put in a public bin or take it home. Easy-peasy and it makes it so much easier for the people collecting that night to have a clean, clear space.

Tenby Community Gardens: If anyone enjoys gardening, there are several opportunities to help. The Edible Community Garden on Sutton St and South Cliff always has bits and pieces needing doing, and there are other patches of public garden around Tenby that could do with a bit of tender loving care. If you are interested, get in touch and we can match you with something suitable.

Committee Members: There are several organisations in Tenby that are doing a great job but are struggling to find committee members. This is often not a big volunteering opportunity, the committees often meet once a month or even once every two or three months, and you can decide how much else you are able to do or not do, so the meetings are the only fixed commitment. It would really help to keep all these things going in Tenby.

Zig Zag: The little patch of North Walk Zig Zag that used to be the Penny Arcade has been taken on as a community project. Coastal images sent in by anyone are being converted to signboards to be hung up along the back wall, and there are several other projects. Some are being undertaken by school children, but there is a lot to do so any help would be great.

Repair Café: This takes place on the second Saturday of each month from 2 – 4 pm in Augustus Place Community Hall. Volunteer repairers are needed – we have someone to help with sewing repairs, and someone for electrics, but we could do with someone who could repair wooden items, and any other everyday things that people might bring in. It would be great to have more than one person for each area, so that people can cover for each other when they go on holiday or anything. We also have a rummage sale and do refreshments, so help with that would be great too. Again, get in touch as above.

Community Group of the Month: Tenby Civic Society

Tenby Civic Society is a charity whose committee meets every other month, the most recent meeting being on Saturday 15th December at 2pm in Augustus Place Community Hall. Planning issues were discussed, and the maintenance of Allen's View. The latest newsletter is just about finalised and will be going out to members in January.

The Society's origins were in the Friends of Tenby organisation which was set up back in 1955 to stimulate public interest in Tenby for both residents and visitors alike. The aim was to protect the elements and features that make Tenby so special by promoting high standards of planning, preservation, development and architecture.

Those aims to develop and maintain the best in Tenby continue today.

The Society is also lucky to have been bequeathed an area of land known as Allen's View, a viewpoint and garden on the Pembrokeshire Coastal Path at the top of Northcliffe, between Tenby and Waterwynch Bay. The Society seeks to manage the gardens ethically and sustainably whilst continuing to provide a public place from which the views are truly breath-taking. We rely completely on volunteers to help us with the task of planting, clearing and sustainably managing the area which provides a unique viewing point and a wonderful place for quiet contemplation....or a picnic!
